
## **Enrolling in E-Verify**

Per Section 448.095, F.S., all public employers, contractors and subcontractors doing business in Florida are required to enroll in E-Verify.

- (2) PUBLIC EMPLOYERS, CONTRACTORS, AND SUBCONTRACTORS.—
- (a) Beginning January 1, 2021, every public employer, contractor, and subcontractor shall register with and use the E-Verify system to verify the work authorization status of all newly hired employees. A public employer, contractor, or subcontractor may not enter into a contract unless each party to the contract registers with and uses the E-Verify system.

## **E-Verify Link**

Once you are on the website, click on the **VIEW CHECKLIST** tab to make sure you have all the information and documentation you need to expedite the enrollment process. Then click the **REVIEW THE PROCESS** tab to take an in-depth look at the entire process to get a better understanding of what is required for enrollment.

An <u>Employer Identification Number</u> (EIN) is required for E-Verify. If you do not have an EIN, you must obtain one before enrolling in E-Verify. You can get an EIN from the IRS <u>online</u>, <u>by fax</u> or <u>by mail</u>. An EIN is different from a Social Security number or individual taxpayer identification number. Do NOT enter either of these numbers in place of an EIN.

An **NAICS code** is also required to enroll in E-Verify. Your insurance agent for your worker's compensation coverage may also be able to assist you with the appropriate NAICS code.
