What's New & Exciting?

'The STEAM Machine'

'The STEAM Machine' has been visiting childcare centers providing onehour sessions that focus on Science, Technology, Engineering, Art, and/or Mathematics.

Promoting STEAM education gives children the opportunity to attain essential skills to connect ideas and integrate knowledge across disciplines, all the while capturing their attention.

ELC has partnered with the School District of Manatee County as 'The STEAM Machine' program continues to grow.



Books For Kids

The ELC of Manatee County was excited to partner with Books For Kids, a project of the Rotary Club of Lakewood Ranch. Their mission is to raise the reading levels of local elementary school students by helping with reading comprehension and by providing "Books For Kids."

Their team of more than 100 community volunteers are professionally trained to go into Title 1 schools, read to children, and engage students in book discussions which foster reading comprehension and critical thinking skills. Each student in the classroom is then given a book to take home.

This year, volunteers from Books For Kids plan to visit about 100 classrooms in Manatee and Sarasota County schools and distribute more than 14,000

books. This will bring the total number of books distributed in the program's six-year history to nearly 50,000.



Van Wezel Performing Arts Hall's Early Learning Institute

The Early Learning Coalition collaborated with the Van Wezel Performing Arts Hall in its Early Learning Institute. The Institute provided a professional development session for the teaching staff of six of our classrooms once, and for four of those a second round. For each session, the Institute's teaching artist and its Education Program Director introduced the lessons they would teach the classroom children using storybooks. The teachers then participated in the activities their children would later encounter. Then the teaching artist visited each classroom three times, with three separate lessons using one book.

In Fall 2017, the Van Wezel staff used the book, Goodnight Moon, to teach social-emotional lessons. In February 2018, those children visited the Van Wezel for this production and one for Runaway Bunny. In Spring 2018, the children learned several lessons from the book, The Gruffalo. Six classrooms were bussed to the Van Wezel to participate in a live professional arts production of the same book. During the summer, the children were taught using the book, Giggle, Giggle, Moo. The children are invited to view the professional production of this book in early Fall 2018.

The ELC lobby is open, airy and inviting to families. The open space and variety of toys, books, and games provides a safe place for children to play and interact with each other.



Child Care Resource and Referral

Child Care Resource and Referral (CCR&R) is the "front door" to the Early Learning Coalition's multiple services. It is a free marketing tool for legally operating providers in Manatee County, as the information they provide is updated immediately in our database, allowing anyone looking for Manatee County child care options to request a list of providers and the services they offer. Parents are educated on how to identify quality care, informed about different types of care and are encouraged to continue looking for quality once their children are placed in a child care facility. These services are provided at no charge.

While CCR&R helps families find child care, it also provides information about other valuable community resources. This information is available in our lobby, on our website and at community events in which the ELC participates.

Those We Serve

In the 2017-2018 fiscal year the Early Learning Coalition of Manatee County provided 1,114 child care referrals

Promoting Early Literacy

As part of the initiative for Family Literacy Opportunities, the Coalition received over 42,000 low cost books from grant opportunities through First Book.

A book is given to every child that comes to the office and at every community event that the Coalition participates in. Bookmarks labeled with "I'm a Reader" are provided with each book. Parents receive a "Reading Tips for Parents of Preschoolers" that offers fun ways they can help their child(ren) become happy and confident readers.

Children's books are present in the lobby of the Coalition office for parents to read to their children while they wait for their appointment. Other literature is present in the lobby and staff offices encouraging the development of literacy at home.

Over 37,000 books were distributed during Every Child a Reader and Literacy for the Holidays; at outreach events such as the Manatee County Fair and Lakewood Ranch Halloween Boofest; to Manatee County School District as part of the Grade Level Reading program, and to United Way to help with the summer learning loss program.

The Early Literacy Coordinator implemented the Raising A Reader program at seven early learning centers, East Coast Migrant Head



Start, and two elementary schools, serving 355 children and providing training to 32 early childhood teachers and directors. Raising A Reader is an evidence-based early literacy and family engagement program that helps parents build the habit of book sharing. Each week a child brings home a bag of high quality books. To help sustain the habit of borrowing and sharing books at end of the program families are connected to their local library.

Voluntary Prekindergarten (VPK)

Voluntary Prekindergarten (VPK) is free for all four-year-old children in Florida. Families do not have income requirements or restrictions.


The VPK program is designed to provide four-year-olds access to quality prekindergarten educational experiences and prepare Florida's children for kindergarten by developing the skills they need to become good readers and successful students.


Those We Serve

In the 2017-2018 fiscal year, the Early Learning Coalition of Manatee County served 2,769 Children 122 VPK Program Providers VPK includes standards for literacy skills, strict accountability, appropriate curricula, substantial instruction periods, manageable class sizes, and qualified instructors. Parents have the option of enrolling children in a school-year program consisting of 540 instructional hours, a summer program consisting of 300 instructional hours, or a

Specialized Instructional Services (SIS) program which takes place outside the traditional classroom setting and is designed for 4-year-olds with special needs.

School Readiness - Child Care Funding Assistance

The School Readiness Program offers financial assistance to low-income families for early child education and care so families can become financially self-sufficient, and their young children can be successful in school in the future.


The program considers a child's physical, social, emotional, and intellectual development; involves parents as their child's first teacher; prepares children to be ready for school; and gives parents information about child development and other topics of interest.

Family Portal

In 2015, the Office of Early Learning (OEL) introduced the Family Portal, which is a comprehensive statewide system where parents can apply for VPK and School Readiness online. The Family Portal can be accessed using any smart phone, tablet, or computer with internet access. Families can upload documents supporting eligibility, sign applications electronically, manage their waiting list status and revalidation for school readiness, and print out VPK certificates of eligibility, allowing the entire application process to be completed online.

Developmental Screening and Early Intervention

Early detection of potential developmental delays allows children to reach their fullest potential and enter kindergarten ready to learn.

The ELC helps to expand child care options for children with disabilities and their families by supporting the inclusion of children with special needs in early childhood settings. Services are available to early care and education providers to increase staff knowledge and competence in serving children with disabilities or behavioral challenges. These services include training, onsite technical assistance, community resource information and environmental adaptations. A toll-free Warm Line is available to parents and early care and education providers needing information related to the disability or special health care needs of children, birth to five years of age.

Coalition staff participates in the Healthy Start Manatee community meetings. The ELC Inclusion Specialist is a Certified Passenger Safety Technician and participates in car seat safety checks. An ELC staff member is a member of the Florida Association of Infant Mental Health.

The ELC partners with the Manatee County School Board and local agencies to participate in community events.

Child Development staff completed 2,444 Ages and Stages Questionnaires developmental screenings. Of these 2,444 developmental screenings, 889 demonstrated potential development delays and families were provided with Individual Early Care Plans which include age and skill specific activities for families to use at home. The families of 23 children were identified as needing further evaluation and were provided assistance in coordinating referrals to other community agencies.

Early Steps To School Success (A Save the Children Program)

The Early Steps to School Success program (A Save the Children program) brought the love of learning to the families of Manatee County after it was launched in the Fall of 2015. The program has served 57 children in our home visiting component and 110 in our Raising a Reader component. Our trained Early Childhood Coordinators brought book exchanges, developmental screenings, educational activities, and fun directly into the families' homes.

Coordinators focused on language, social and emotional, cognitive, and physical development. Parents were encouraged to implement new skills with their child in between visits and to support their child's growth, preparing them for school. Parent-child groups occurred once a month to connect the families in the program. Our Coordinators also worked directly with teachers and parents of pre-K students to encourage reading at home. Book bags were sent home weekly and parents were encouraged to read, sing, or share a story with their child. All services were FREE.

Nemours Reading BrightStart! Program (NRBS!)

NRBS! is a literacy intervention program dedicated to the prevention of reading failure in young children. Started in 2005 through the generous funding of the Nemours Foundation (a large pediatric health system), NRBS! is based on the premise that because child health and learning are intricately linked, therefore reading failure is a major child health issue.

The ELC implemented its Practice-Based Coaching program using NRBS! in November 2015. The coalition presented each provider with a Nemours Reading BrightStart! Lesson Plan Kit, Manipulatives Kit, and book set. Each teacher was assigned a coach to serve as an essential resource for the program. These coaches made regular visits to each classroom to maintain the fidelity of the program and to facilitate the professional learning and teaching-practice improvement of the classroom teachers by offering individualized curricular support.

During the 2017-2018 year, ELC served 30 classrooms in 12 programs. The 35 participating teachers indicated overwhelmingly that they enjoyed use of this program. ELC prescreened 262 children in four-year-old classrooms. 236 were post-screened using the Get Ready to Read-Revised Screening Tool, with the balance dropping due to attrition. Results of the post-screening found that 221 children scored ready for kindergarten, a success rate of 94%.

ELC prescreened 166 children in three-year-old classrooms. 151 were post-screened using the Get Ready to Read-Revised Screening Tool, with the balance dropping due to attrition. Results of the post-screening found that 137 children scored as making age-appropriate progress on their paths to being ready for kindergarten, a success rate of 91%.

Deputy Friendly

The Deputy Friendly program began in January 2016 as a pilot and continues to expand. This collaboration with the Manatee County Sheriff's Department, is designed to humanize children's perceptions of law enforcement officers and their work, and improve rapport between children and law enforcement.

The program is designed for children aged three to five and involves monthly visits by the deputies to school classrooms, a book for centers to add to their library, and follow-up activities conducted by the teachers. Deputy Friendly continues to reach 41 classrooms throughout Manatee County.


Kindermusik


Kindermusik is dedicated to using the power of music to help children grow during the years most critical to brain development. Each kit includes developmentally appropriate, safety-tested instruments and manipulatives to enhance music-based learning activities. Currently 80 children ages one to five are using the program at Palma Sola Early Learning Academy.



2017-2018 Total Funding

The Early Learning Coalition of Manatee County (ELC) received federal and state funding in excess of \$16,000,000 during this fiscal year. Over 78% of School Readiness funds and 96% of Voluntary Prekindergarten (VPK) funds were spent directly on child care services through our local child care providers and school district. Our overall administrative costs for these programs were 4.41% and 4% respectively. The ELC was awarded additional local grant dollars in excess of \$2,414,000.

Transition to Kindergarten

The Early Learning Community Task Force (Early Learning Coalition of Manatee County, Manatee Community Action Agency Head Start/Early Head Start, and the School District of Manatee County) in partnership with the South Florida Museum and The Patterson Foundation, developed and implemented four evenings of fun, food, and information about transitioning from preschool to kindergarten.

Families and their rising kindergartners from four Title I schools, and the community preschools feeding into those schools, came to the South Florida Museum on four separate evenings in May 2018. When families and preschool directors and teachers arrived,

they went to the Planetarium and saw a video, "Miss Luanne's Front Porch," featuring Luanne Howe from the School District outlining the learning areas to experience throughout the evening.

This series hosted over 400 people in four 1.5-hour sessions. As a continuation, the rest of the 1500 kindergarten readiness bags were distributed to the prekindergarten classes in the School District selected sites, Head Start selected Sites and School Readiness and/or VPK programs at private providers in the selected school areas.



6th Annual ELC Golf Classic

The 6th Annual ELC of Manatee County Golf Classic hosted by State Representative Jim Boyd was held at IMG Academy Golf Club on November 3rd and was again a resounding success.

The event is the Coalition's largest fundraiser and has become a big favorite in the local golf calendar, with 100 players taking part. Fairy Tale Follies
